Disciplinary Policy for Members of the SquamishValley Rod and Gun Club

The board shall have authority to suspend or expel any member from the Squamish Valley Rod & Gun Club (hereafter refered to as the Society) for any one or more of the following grounds:

- 1. violating any provision of the articles, by-laws, or written policies and rules of the Society
- 2. carrying out any conduct which may be detrimental to the Society as determined by the board in its sole discretion;
- 3. for any other reason that the board in its sole and absolute discretion considers to be reasonable, having regard to the purpose of the Society

Should the member in question be a member of the Board they shall absence themselves from the Board until a special meeting has been held and a decision has been reached.

In the event that the board determines by a majority of board members present that a club member should be expelled or suspended from membership in the Society, the president, or such other officer as may be designated by the board, shall provide (10) days notice of suspension or expulsion to the member and shall provide reasons for the proposed suspension or expulsion. The club member may make written submissions to the president, or such other officer as may be designated by the board, in response to the notice received within such (10) day period. In the event that no written submissions are received by the president, the president, or such other officer as may be designated by the board, may proceed to notify the member that the member is suspended or expelled from membership in the Society. If written submissions are received in accordance with this section, the board will convene an extraordinary meeting of the board to consider such submissions. In arriving at a final decision by a majority of board members present, the president, or such other officer as may be designated by the board, shall notify the member concerning such final decision within a further (10) days from the date of receipt of the submissions. The board's decision shall be final and binding on the member, without any further right of appeal.
